



President of the United States of America,

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

**Know Ye,** That, in consideration of military service performed by Samuel Selden a Lieutenant for ten months more than six years,

to the United States, in the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment, and in pursuance of an Act of the Congress of the United States, passed on the 10th day of August, in the year 1790, intituled "An act to enable the Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment to obtain titles to certain lands lying north west of the River Ohio, between the little Miami and Sciota;" and another Act of the said Congress, passed on the 9th day of June, in the year 1794, amendatory of the said Act, there is granted by the said United States unto

John Stroup assignee of Charles A. Stuart, assignee of Nathaniel Massie assignee of Miles Selden, heir at law of Gill Armistead Selden, devisee of the said Samuel Selden, deceased

a certain tract of land, containing one hundred acres situate between the little Miami and Sciota Rivers, north west of the River Ohio, as by survey, bearing date the twenty third day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and eleven and bounded and described as follows, TO WIT: survey of one hundred acres of land on part

of a military warrant N<sup>o</sup>. 5647 in favor of the said Miles Selden, (the whole thereof being for three hundred and seventy acres) on the head waters of Paint Creek, Beginning, at a white oak, Southwest corner to Puthuff and Langham's entry N<sup>o</sup>. 6262, running with said line East 332 poles to a stake; thence South 48<sup>3</sup>/<sub>10</sub> poles to a stake; thence West 332 poles to two hickories from one root; thence North 48<sup>7</sup>/<sub>10</sub> poles to the beginning

with the appurtenances: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John Stroup and his heirs and assigns forever.
